BROWN SKUA

Family Stercorariidae
Species Catharacta skua lonnbergi
Common names Brown Skua or Southern Skua
Status Native
Abundance Common in selected areas.
Size 630 mm (cf sparrow 145 mm, Black-backed Gull 600 mm)
Habitat A coastal species during the breeding season which ranges into deeper

waters over the winter months.

Worldwide range Circumpolar with Subantarctic distribution.

New Zealand range The New Zealand subspecies (*C. s. lonnbergi*) ranges around the south of the South Island, Stewart Island, Snares Island and to the islands further south. It sometimes is seen around Cook Strait when not breeding.

Discussion Skuas can be described as predatory gulls with the Brown Skua being well known as both a predator and a scavenger content to raid nesting colonies of penguins, shearwaters, gulls and terns. Although it is bigger than the South Pole Skua (*C. maccormicki*) it has a wide size range and so can be confused with it, and with the immature Black-back Gull.

Description

Upperparts and underparts Dark brown. **Wings** Dark brown with white wing-flashes on both sides of the wing primary feathers.

Conspicuous feature

White wing-flashes.

Call "Charr-charr" at nesting site only.

Nest Breeds either in loose colonies or as a solitary breeder making a scrape of a nest on a promontory lined with grasses, twigs and dried seaweed. Up to 2 light brown, blotched with dark brown, eggs are laid.

Differences between the Brown Skua and the immature Black-backed Gull

- The Skua is heavier looking.
- The Skua has wider wings.
- The Skua has very conspicuous white on the wings.
- The Skua has a thicker neck.
- The Skua has a much heavier bill with a hook on the end.

Differences between the Brown Skua and the South Pole Skua

- · Brown Skua appears of heavier.
- Brown Skua is of a warmer brown colouring.
- The South Pole Skua is of a generally darker brown except around the face and neck where it has creamy tonings.
